Lord Chancellor sets out AI vision for the courts

February 24, 2026

Deputy Prime Minister and Lord Chancellor David Lammy announced a sweeping AI agenda for England and Wales. The plan is anchored by J-AI, an AI listing assistant for the criminal courts that will help judges flag cases needing action, estimate hearing time, and identify opportunities to list additional cases; according to *Legal Futures*, the tool is based on technology used by the National Health Service to speed up processes and cut waiting times. Microsoft Copilot is already being used by Ministry of Justice staff and is being expanded across courts and tribunals for hearing transcription, document anonymization, and judgment summarization. *Legal Futures* reports £12 million in additional funding for the Ministry's Justice AI Unit and £4.5 million over three years for LawtechUK, alongside plans for a Justice AI academy and fellowship program (the Justice AI Fellowship for senior AI specialists and the Justice AI Academy internship program for top graduates, both first set out in the July 2025 AI Action Plan for Justice).

UK immigration tribunal judges trained to use Microsoft Copilot

Training materials first reported by The Observer show UK immigration tribunal judges have been trained to use a restricted version of Microsoft Copilot to draft skeleton rulings, generate case outlines, summarize evidence bundles, and check decisions. The asylum appeals backlog has nearly doubled to 104,400 cases.

Lady Justice Initiative and Justice Tech Association release Women Building the Future of Justice Dashboard

March 2026

Lady Justice Initiative and Justice Tech Association released the Women Building the Future of Justice Dashboard, a first-of-its-kind resource profiling 181 women leaders across 30 countries who are building justice technology, leading legal aid innovation, advancing ecosystem support, and driving AI transformation in the public sector. The dashboard highlights leaders working in the areas of law that affect people's lives most directly — divorce, gender-based violence, employment discrimination, immigration, and trusts and estates. Georgetown's Evidence for Justice Lab launches Justice and AI Tracker

January 2026

The Evidence for Justice Lab at Georgetown University's McCourt School of Public Policy released the Justice and AI Tracker (JAI-T), an interactive web tool documenting where and how AI technologies are piloted, tested, or implemented across United States law enforcement, courts, and corrections. The first release covers the 100 largest United States cities. Lab researchers identified five recurring AI use cases in policing: facial recognition, gun detection, automatic license plate readers, body camera footage review, and non-emergency dispatch assistance.

Judicial AI Consortium reaches 200 sitting judges since January launch

April 24, 2026

The Judicial AI Consortium, a judges-only forum launched in January 2026 by Judge Scott Schlegel of the Louisiana Fifth Circuit, U.S. Magistrate Judge Maritza Dominguez Braswell of the District of Colorado, and Judge Xavier Rodriguez of the Western District of Texas, has grown to roughly 200 sitting judges as of March. The consortium gives judges a closed space to compare notes on drafting with AI, legal research, case management, ethics, and the evidentiary implications of deepfakes.

Amicable co-founder Kate Daly publishes guide to divorce without the drama

March 26, 2026

Kate Daly, co-founder of Amicable (UK), released her first book, "amicable divorce: Your Practical Guide to Divorce Without the Drama," published by Profile Books and Souvenir Press. The book draws on Amicable's work helping thousands of UK couples separate without engaging two opposing solicitors, and on Daly's role in the campaign that brought no-fault divorce to England and Wales in 2022. Amicable, which Daly co-founded with Pip Wilson, is a B Corp-certified separation service that pairs technology with relationship counselling and family law expertise.

Trustate, founded by Leah Del Percio and Tara Faquir, now serves nearly 1,000 law firms and financial institutions across all 51 U.S. jurisdictions. The Tampa-based platform automates trusts and estates work — locating assets, managing workflows, drafting estate documents — and reports saving customers approximately 400 hours per client.

AI in Global Majority Judicial Systems

Stimson Center, 2026

Forty-four percent of judges report using AI tools. Only nine percent have institutional guidelines. The report examines AI deployment across the Global South, including Brazil's SIGMA system and Shenzhen Court's integration of large language models into judicial reasoning. The Shenzhen integration is the first known instance of LLM use in formal judicial decision-making.

Foundational research mapping 66 people-centered justice initiatives from 31 organizations across Victoria, Australia, surfacing the common elements that underpin success. Develops an exploratory People-Centered Justice Model that informs how the justice sector designs, measures, and understands its work, and a benchmark for what accountability to affected communities actually requires.
